

HIDING LIGHT

Volume ceilings are lovely, but often difficult to light. One solution is to build a trellis of false, non-structural beams to cradle hidden fluorescent fixtures, as shown in this Oakland, Calif., custom home. Custom-built by a cabinet maker, the maple-veneered box-beams match the maple flooring and cabinetry used throughout the contemporary Craftsman-style house. Incandescent pendant fixtures supplement California's Title 24-required fluorescent lighting, and because they're not



stuck way up high, both kinds of lamps are easier to change.
